The economic drain that the law courts cause has at no time been considered. And yet it is not a trifle. Every institution found under the present system is run on a most extravagant scale. Law courts are probably the most extravagantly run. I have some knowledge of the scale in England, a fair knowledge of the Indian and an intimate knowledge of the South African. I have no hesitation in saying that the Indian is comparatively the most extravagant and bears no relation to the general economic condition of the people. The best South African lawyers and they are lawyers of great ability – dare not charge the fees the lawyers in India do. Fifteen guineas is almost a top fee for legal opinion. Several thousand rupees have been known to have been charged in India. There is something sinful in a system under which it is possible for a lawyer to earn from fifty thousand to one lakh rupees per month. Legal practice is not – ought not to be – a speculative business. The best legal talent must be available to the poorest at reasonable rates. But we have copied and improved upon the practice of the English lawyers. Englishmen find the climate of India trying. The habits imbued in India, ample margin is kept for frequent migrations to the hills and to their island home and an equally ample margin is kept for the education of an exclusive and aristocratic type for their children. He scale of their fees is naturally therefore pitched very high. But India cannot bear the heavy drain. We fancy that, in order to feel the equals of these English lawyers, we must charge the same killing fees that the English do. It would be a sad day for India if it has to inherit the English scale and the English tastes so utterly unsuitable to the Indian environment. Any lawyer looking at the law courts and the profession of law from the viewpoints. I have ventured to suggest cannot keep coming to the conclusion that if he wants to serve the nation to the best of his ability, the first condition of service is suspension of his practice. He can come to a different conclusion only if he successfully changes the statement of facts I have made.

As regards master and servant, the general principal is well established. The emphasis here is on the essential requirement of 'course of employment'. If the unauthorized and wrongful act of the servant is not so connected with the authorized act as to be a mode of doing that authorized act, then the master is not liable, for in such a case the servant is not acting the course of employment, but is going outside it. It is obvious that the above criterion requires us to draw mentally a circle that delimits the 'course of employment' and to remember that the master is liable for all acts (of the servant) within that circle. This in its turn, requires us to ascertain, first, whether there is an 'employment' relationship and secondly, to ascertain the circle denoted by the course of employment. The course of employment is not ordinarily defined with precision. What the employment relationship fails to provide for, must therefore be adjudicated upon by the courts. In a well known English case the owner of a car which was being driven from London to Monte Carlo at the owner's request and for his benefit was held liable for the drivers negligence in causing a collision. The test applied was "purposes" of the master – an extension of the concept of employment. This approach seems to have been adopted by the Supreme Court of India when holding that the owner is liable for the negligence of the driver (servant), not only if he is acting in the course of his employment, but also when the driver is, with the owner's consent driving the car on the owner's business or for the owner's purposes.

A brief resume of the general scenario of the fifty years' case law regarding environmental justice in its statistical form is placed below the inside of the judicial exercises. There were in all 88 judgements handed down by the Supreme Court at the dawn of the next millennium. The year 1998 saw the highest number of judgements whereas there were not a single judgement in the years 1981, 1982 and 1986. Five cases were decided by the full bench, otherwise it was generally a two judges bench. On four occasions the judges recorded separate opinions and in two cases, the judges provided a 'somewhat different' approach or gave a dissent on a point or two but finally concured with the majority. A large number of advocates have fought environmental litigation by M. C. Mehta stands out. The litigation pertained to twelve different states of India of which 30 per cent pertained to the state of Uttar Pradesh, followed by Delhi (15 per cent) and Madhya Pradesh (10 per cent). A surprising aspect in this case law was that the developed states contributed negligible case law and the under developed states hardly opened any account. The eco-ciders belonged to multinationals, government and private corporations. There were companies of repute and long standing. The Government and Governmental agencies were also dragged to the apex court, where they were exposed for greed and grab-what-you-can ethos of the industries.

It ought undoubtedly to be our aim to raise the minds of the natives and to take care that wherever our connection with India might cease it did not appear that the only fruit of our dominion these had been to leave the people more object and less able to govern themselves than when we found them. Many different plans may be suggested for the improvement of their character but one of them can be successful unless it is first laid down as a main principle of our policy, that the improvement must be made. This principle once established, we must trust to time and perseverance for realizing the object of it. We have had too little experience, and are too little acquainted with the natives, to be able to determine without trial what means should be most likely to facilitate their improvement, various measures might be suggested which might all probably be more or less useful, but no one appears to me so well calculated to insure success as that of endeavouring to give them higher opinion of themselves, by placing more confidence in them, by imploring them in important situations, and perhaps by rendering them eligible to almost every office under Government. It is not necessary at present to define the exact limit to which their eligibility should be carried, but there seems to be no reason why they should be excluded from any office for which they are qualified, without danger to the preservation of our own ascendancy.
