


THE OBJECTIVE:

Understanding and appreciating their own environment's natural and cultural resources, as well as society, technology, and productivity, are all aided by having an awareness of environmental issues. Environmental education aims to raise public awareness of environmental issues, investigate potential solutions, and establish the groundwork for an individual's fully informed and active participation in environmental protection and the wise and responsible use of natural resources.

As early as 1930, the Indian education system included various environmental elements in its curricula. Additionally, the Kothari panel (1964–1966) recommended that EE be included in basic education and connected to the needs and goals of the people and the country.

"The aims of teaching science in the primary schools should be to develop proper understanding of the main facts, concepts, principles and processes in the physical and biological environment," the report said for the primary level. Different approaches were taken to environmental education at the primary, secondary, and upper secondary levels.

Every student's education must include environmental education. It contributes to the promotion of environmental consciousness, which breeds knowledgeable concern and motivates proactive involvement in the solution of environmental issues


